This project is a partnership between Wateraid, Ministry of Health, KCCA, Ministry of Water and Environment, Makerere University School of Public Health and Emory University.

The general objective of the study is to assess the WASH status, associated factors and management systems for WASH sustainability in HCFs in Kampala and Metropolitan areas.

The specific objectives of the project include:

- 1. To establish the status of WASH (water supply and quality, sanitation, hygiene, waste management and cleaning routines) in HCFs.
- 2. To assess the WASH practices and behaviours for both health practitioners and clients in HCFs
- 3. To assess factors associated with status of WASH in HCF
- 4. To assess management systems for WASH sustainability in HCFs (policies, guidelines, budgets/budget gaps, HR/responsibilities, structures, plans).
- 5. Recommend appropriate models (management and service delivery) for WASH sustainability in HCFs
