2. Project description

- a. Project Name: WASH for Health Care Facilities
- b. Project Description: Realize assessment of WASH in Health Care Facilities (HCF) according to existing tools and a program to attend the needs identified in the rural Haiti context.
- c. Project Location / Country: Port au Prince, Haiti with weekly trips to provinces in rural villages.

3. Student engagement

- a. Describe student role in the project:
 - i. Research/study existing tools for WASH in HCF
 - ii. Apply the tool in different HCF in Haiti defined by PWW and train the local staff on the use of the tool
 - iii. Data analysis and report writing
 - iv. Help the Haiti team to create an educational program for HCF staffs in order to answer the needs identified
 - v. Write the details of the WASH in HCF program designed for PWW's activities
- b. Expected deliverables: conduct assessment, a detailed plan and educational program to address needs determined in the assessment.
- c. Specific skill requirements (qualitative, survey design, including language):
 - i. French or Creole (spoken and written),
 - ii. Survey creation and information gathering,
 - iii. Data analysis and survey creation
 - iv. Experience creating educational programs
 - v. Public health / WASH major student (at least undergrad level)
 - vi. Experience living/travelling in developing country and working in rural areas

vii. Adaptability to different contexts

- d. Is the Project paid or unpaid? Is there any in-kind support (e.g., housing)? This would be an unpaid position. While student is in Haiti, PWW is willing to help recommend safe lodging, provide office space and travel related to the project.
- e. Timeline (students are typically available to travel to the site between May and August, but can work with the team both before and after this work): The student is expected to start literature review and planning from March 2019. In-country travel from May to August for data collection and data analysis /report writing from August until early October 2019
- 4. What should students submit when applying (CV, cover letter)?
 - a. A CV and cover letter, sent to the email address above would be needed.
 - b. By when should students apply? By January 2019
