 - a. Project Name: Closing the Gap Studying current conditions to help improve health outcomes
 - b. Project Description: Measuring Health Impact for Rural Communities

- 3. Student engagement
 - a. Describe student role in the project:
 - i. Adjust needs assessment to include critical health indicators
 - ii. Conduct a desk survey of various best practices in health needs assessment,
 - iii. Define key questions and issues for rural Honduras, communities with limited access to health care or improved water treatment or sanitation,
 - iv. Select the appropriate methods of assessment,
 - v. Work with local staff to conduct the pilot survey, and
 - vi. Analyze the survey results for pilot assessment.
 - b. Expected deliverables:
 - i. Summary of Desk Survey Conduct,
 - ii. Develop needs assessment of health indicators by defining key questions and issues to address,
 - iii. Conduct a pilot survey in one or two rural Honduran communities,
 - iv. Analyze the results, and
 - v. Develop a timetable and procedures for repeated follow up by local staff.



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- c. Specific skill requirements (qualitative, survey design, including language): Spanish (spoken and written), survey creation and information gathering, ability to review results and create implementation plan.
- d. Is the Project paid or unpaid? Is there any in-kind support (e.g., housing)? This would be an unpaid position. While student is in Honduras, PWW is willing to help locate safe housing, provide office space and travel related expenses to the project.
- e. Timeline (students are typically available to travel to the site between May and August, but can work with the team both before and after this work): The earlier portion of this timeframe would work best due to rainy season.
