2. Project description
  - a. Project Name: Program Learning & Effectiveness (L&E)
  - b. Project Description: In 2017, WaterAid Cambodia (WACam) established its first three-year country strategy (2017-2020), which set in place a broad set of strategic intents by which the country program would work to achieve its vision of everyone, everywhere having access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene. The country strategy also identifies Learning and Evidence as one of the key pathways to making change happen:  
  
*"WaterAid will learn from its own experiences and the work of others, pursue an impactful research agenda and facilitate wider sector knowledge management. We will maximize new technology and social media to develop real-time learning systems. We will model solutions, evaluating the process and documenting the costs to generate evidence and communicate this in compelling ways to bring about policy changes. We will systematically evaluate program themes to inform sector practices, set WaterAid's future direction and demonstrate impact. (WACam Country Strategy, pg. 17)"*  
  
The purpose of the Learning & Effectiveness team is to support program teams to build evidence that informs the direction and influence their work has towards achieving their program objectives and the WACam strategic intents.

3. Student engagement



- a. Describe student role in the project: WaterAid Cambodia is seeking one to two students to be a part of the L&E team. The student(s) will assist WaterAid Cambodia program teams to design and implement a rapid research project aimed at addressing a key area WaterAid Cambodia's learning agenda. The exact project will be identified based on program need and student interests.
  - b. Expected deliverables: Research tools (survey, focus group and/or key informant interview guide), Final Report (5-15 pgs), Presentation (30 min)
  - c. Specific skill requirements (qualitative, survey design, including language): Study design, qualitative and quantitative analysis, previous experience training/coaching a plus.
  - d. Is the Project paid or unpaid? Is there any in-kind support (e.g., housing)? Unpaid. When conducting data gathering/field work outside of Phnom Penh, WaterAid Cambodia will cover per-diem and costs associated with transport and accommodations.
  - e. Timeline (students are typically available to travel to the site between May and August, but can work with the team both before and after this work):  
January – April: Identify project, develop ToR, begin literature review.  
May - June: Develop and test research tools and methodology  
July: Conduct data collection  
August: Analyze data and draft report and presentation.
